HOODS FROM TURBOT TOWNSHIP, PA AND ROMULUS, NY

A last will and testament was published for John Hood, Sr. (born about 1730) in 1790, naming sons George, William, Andrew, John, and Robert Hood, and daughters Elizabeth and Mary Haynes. This occurred in Northumberland County, PA. The will was proved in April 1796. In 1800, the above Robert's last will and testament was published in Romulus, Cayuga County, NY (Seneca County was created from Cayuga County March 29, 1804) naming a wife Jean and children James, Elizabeth and Jean. It also mentions brothers George, William, John and Andrew. (Jean = Jane)

I...have replied to your query in which you mentioned four Hood brothers settled in the area of ROMULUS. You said that James was the son of one of the four. Below is a typed copy of a will was sent to me. I do not know yet who typed it. It mentions James as the son of Robert. You will also notice a daughter Elizabeth whom I believe became the wife of Joseph McDuffie. Joseph McDuffie and Elizabeth HOOD are my 3 great grandparents.

The four brothers you mentioned George, William, Andrew, and John were listed in a 1790 will in Northumberland County with their brother Robert. Their father was John Sr. I have a handwritten copy which I can copy for you if you wish. I would like to know more about your connection and information.

The Last Will and Testament of John Hood, Sr.

The following 1790 Last Will and Testament of John Hood, Sr. of Turbot Township, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, was transcribed by Charles W. Paige of Pasadena, California from a photocopy sent to him by William Mutch of Chico, California. The very bottom of the "Be it remembered" portion was missing, as well as some of the wording along the right-hand border. Anything enclosed in brackets "[]" was added by Charles to replace missing information as he deemed appropriate and in keeping with the wording in rest of the Will.

A search for the father and five brothers in the 1790 Federal Census for Pennsylvania shows a John Hood, Sr., a George Hood, a William Hood and a Robert Hood all living in Northumberland County. (All of them were listed on census page 187 except for William, who was listed on page 185.) Thus it appears that John, Jr. and Andrew were still living at home.

The 1840 census for Pennsylvania shows a William Hood living in Turbot Township, Northumberland County.

John Hood's Will-

In the Name of God Amen; the fourteenth Day of June in the Year of our Lord God One thousand seven hundred and ninety, I John Hood of Torbit Township, [County] of Northumberland and State of Pennsylvania, being weak of Body, but in perfect and [disposing mind and] memory thanks be to God, calling to mind the Mortality of the Body and that its appointed for all Men once to die, I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. First of all I recommend my soul to God that gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian like and decent manner, nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Almighty Power of God, and as touching such Worldly Substance as it hath pleased God to bless me with, I give and Dispose of it in the following manner and form. It is my Will and I do Order that my Funeral Charges and all my Just Debts be paid out of the whole of my Goods and Estate. I desire that my Dear Wife may have Three Cows and Six Sheep, such as She choses, and to have what part of the House She chooses and to be found in sufficient meat, drink and clothing during her life, and to be paid three pounds yearly while She lives out of the whole of my Estate and to keep the Bed She formerly had, and trunk likewise, and what Pewter She now has. I give and bequeath to my Son George Hood the Sum of thirty pounds to be paid out of the whole of my Estate after the purchase Money of my Lands is all paid. I give and bequeath to my sons William and Robert Hood the one half of my Lands, the part where they now live on the meadow Ground and Wood Lands lying on that part of the Plantation to be equally divided with the other part; Excepting the Meadow that is now cleared, and to keep what part of the stock and Farming Utensials they now have. I give and bequeath to my sons John and Andrew the half of my Lands that I now live on and to keep what part of the stock and Farming Utensials they now have except such as I give to my Dear Wife. I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Elizabeth and Mary Haynes, each one the sum of twenty pounds to be paid by their four Brothers after they have paid for all their Lands. I give and bequeath to my Grand Child Rachel Magill the sum of twenty Pounds to be paid to her when she arrive at full age of twenty years by her four Uncles and to keep what has been given her. It is my Will that my son Andrew Hood take care of my Dear Wife during her life, likewise that he have Seven pounds Worth more out of the whole of my stock than the Rest of his Brothers. I constitute and Ordain the only and Sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament via Robert and John Hood to take the management of my affairs and to divide and dispose of my Worldly Substance according to the above Direct[ion], and I do hereby disanul and Revoak all and every other former Testaments Wills and Legacies Bequeaths & Executors by me in any wise heretofore willed and bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming this my last Will and Testament Published, pronounced and declared [by] me the said John Hood the day and year above written. John Hood [his seal] Signed Sealed & Declared in presence of us Jacob Follmer, Nel McMullan, Northumberland County [seals]. Be it remembered that on the twenty sixth Day of April in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety six, Jacob Follmer and Nel McMullen, two of the subscribing Witnesses to the [fore]going Will who being duly Sworn according to Law, saith they were personally present & did see John Hood the Testator sign seal & declare the foregoing writing to be his last Will and Testament and that at the time of his so Publishing the said will he was of sound and disposing mind & memory as the deponents do believe according to the best of their Knowledge & Understanding, that the Deponents respectively wrote their

Names as Witnesses in the presence of each other. And further saith not. Sworn & Subscribed the same Day and Year, Before Jn Simpson Reg[istrar]

Be it remembered,

that on the twenty sixth Day of April in the Year of our Lord [One thousand seven hundred and ninety six] before me was proved and approved the last Will and Testament of the said John Hood, deceased, of which the foregoing Record is a true Copy and Letters Testamentary y[?] in due and Common Form of Law, to Robert Hood and John Hood, Executors therein....

The Last Will and Testament of Robert Hood

The following Last Will and Testament of Robert Hood of Romulus, New York, was sent electronically to Charles Paige by William Mutch.

"The following is a true and exact copy of the original document dated Aug. 4, 1800, which is on file (Book A1, page 26) at the Surrogates Office, Cayuga County Court House, Auburn, New York. The spelling and punctuation are copied exactly as they appear on the original." [William Mutch]

Last Will and Testament of Robert Hood

In the name of God, Amen. I Robert Hood of Romulus in the County of Cayuga, State of New York, yeoman, being of sound and desposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say;

First I will that all my debts and funeral charges be paid and discharged by my exectutors herein after mentioned. Also, its my will, if my Brother Andrew cannot or doesnot, hold the land, that was surveyed to him, and has now improved, that he shall get as much off, ye west end of my lot I now live on as will be my share after Brother George has his share surveyed unto him where he lives that has been agreed upon, I say my share together with my Brother Williams and Johns share as will make said Andrew an equal quanity of land with myself ye forsaid William and John, but if Andrew holds his lot I hold mine also. Also I give my dearly beloved wife Jean the third part of my real estate during life subject to ye aforesaid encumberances and ye two parts of my personal estate and ye best room in my house, also I give and demise, unto my son James the half of this lot 1 now live on to ye said James, him and his heirs and assigns forever subject to ye encumbrances herein mentioned. Also I give and demise unto my two daughters Elizabeth and Jean the other half of ye foresaid lot share and share alike to the said Elizabeth and Jean, them their heirs and assigns forever subject to ve encumberances herein mentioned likewise I give ve rest of my personal estate to be divided between my three children, James, Elizabeth, and Jean share and share alike Lastly I do make and constitute my said two brothers, John and Andrew exect. of my last will and testament and empower them to sell such a part of ye land as they in their wisdom shall see fit for maintainance and schooling of me three children, in witness

whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal the fourth day of August, one thousand and eight hundred.

Romulus, Seneca County, New York

John Hood, son of John Hood, Sr., was born 10 June 1762 in Sunbury, Northumberland County, Pennsylvania, and fought in the Revolutionary War. Afterwards, he with three of his brothers moved to an area that later became Seneca County. He died in 1832 in Romulus. In early church records for the First Presbyterian Church of Romulus, dated circa 1807, are listed a William Hood and Rebecca, his wife. An 1817 list adds Andrew and wife Margaret Hood. Also, a jury list for Romulus dated 1804 lists a George Hood, a William Hood and an Andrew Hood. An 1800 New York census shows residing in Cayuga County, New York a John Hood, a William Hood, a George Hood, an Andrew Hood, and a Jane Hood, all on census page 530. [As mentioned earlier, Seneca County was created from Cayuga County on March 29, 1804, at which time Romulus became part of Seneca County.]

DESCENDANTS OF BROTHER JOHN HOOD AND LUCINDA:

John Hood was married to Lucinda Moody, born circa 1773 in Massachusetts. Their son William Hood was born December 27, 1805 in Romulus and was married on December 1, 1831, also in Romulus, to Louisa Bartlett, daughter of Thomas. William worked by the month until saving enough money to buy 160 acres of land in Michigan, after which he traveled to that state to make the purchase, which occurred in 1835. He then returned to New York to work two more years so that he could afford to take his family to the new land.

The William Hood family arrived in Rome Township, Lenawee County, Michigan on September 20, 1837. After several years of financial travail, they finally had a farm of their own. Included in the household, when they moved to Michigan, was William's widowed mother Lucinda, who died in 1862 at an advanced age. The 1850 Federal Census Report for Rome, Lenawee County, Michigan, enumerated September 10, shows the following on Page 570 for Dwelling 834 and Family 842:

- William Hood, age 44, a farmer with a value of \$2000 and born in NY. [William died in Lenawee County, MI on 23 December 1885 at age 80 years. His parents were listed as John and Lucinda Hood.]
- Louisa Hood, age 38 and also born in NY.
- Hannah B. Hood, age 17 and born in NY.
- Mary Hood, age 16 and born in NY.
- Andrew Hood, age 14 and born in NY.
- Caroline Hood, age 12 and born in MI.
- Lewis Hood, age 10 and born in MI.
- Nancy Hood, age 8 and born in MI.
- Harriet A. Hood, age 2 and born in MI.
- Lucinda Hood, age 77 and born in MA.

John and Lucinda Hood also had a known daughter Jane A, born circa 1815. She married first to Seth Atwood, and second to Isaac Raymond. There were probably other children, also, especially considering the number of years between the births of the two known children. But William and Jane are currently the only two that can be positively linked to them.

Some probable, additional offspring are:

John Hood, Jr. was born in Seneca County circa 1799 and moved to Erie, Pennsylvania at age 22. There he was married to Olive Hall, daughter of Harvey. She had been born circa 1803 in Connecticut. The family moved to Rome Township, Lenawee County, Michigan in 1833, and later to Adrian, also in Lenawee County.

Moses G. Hood was born 6 Nov. 1807, probably Seneca Co., NY, and was married to Adelia A. Knowles, born 1804/11 in CT. Moved to Rome Twp., Lenawee Co., MI by 1840, and in the 1850 census were shown as next door to Jane, daughter of John Hood, Sr. Known children: 1) Miriam, born 24 Nov. 1840 (m. Levi Hawley); Homer, born circa 1843; 3) Philanda, born circa 1846; 4) Milton, born circa 1848. [Ref: P&BA-Len pg. 194]

Robert M. Hood and wife Lydia (Lautenschlager) were born in PA, and after their marriage moved to Varick, Seneca Co., NY, where they stayed. Children:

1) James B. was born September 25, 1825 in Seneca Co., NY. He first moved to Wayne Co., MI, and in 1844 to Rome Twp., Lenawee Co., MI. Was married October 8, 1846 to Lourica Knowles, dau. of Hezekiah Knowles, Sr. At time of 1850 census the family was living next door to Moses G. and near Jane. In 1861 they settled in Adrian Twp., and in 1874 Madison Twp. Children: 1) Irving A., born circa 1848 (m. Mary A. Van Doren, Kansas); 2) Robert Adolphus, born circa 1850 (m. Lucretia A. Todd, Adrian); 3) Margaret a. (m. Alfred T. Hoag, Seneca Falls, NY); 4) Charles O. (m. Emma Wackham, Madison Twp.); 5) Josephine (died age 4); 6) Cora A. (m. Augustus A. Iiseman, Madison Twp.) 2) Susan A., born 1827 in NY and was married to James T. Finch, the family settling in Rome, Lenawee Co., MI

DESCENDANTS OF BROTHER GEORGE HOOD AND MARGARET:

George Hood and John Gamber were Revolutionary War soldiers. Both received war grants about 1796 for land in the finger lakes region of New York. John Gamber's daughter Elizabeth was married to George's son Samuel Hood. George settled in the Waterloo/Fayette area of Seneca County, NY. Some of the Hoods were buried at the Burgh Cemetery near Waterloo. [Much of the following information was provided by Richard Lewis Hood of Trenton, MI.]

The following 1869 autobiographical sketch by David Hood was originally taken from the following source, transcribed into World Family Tree CD #12, Pedigree #1865 for David Hood, son of George and Margaret Hood.

Thomas, Arad: PIONEER HISTORY OF ORLEANS COUNTY, NEW YORK...; Albion, N.Y.: H. A. Bruner, Orleans American Steam Press Print. 1871; p. 364-366.

"I was born in the town of Tarbot, Pennsylvania, August 2d, 1794. In 1797 my parents removed to Seneca, N. Y., town of Romulus. We had many hardships and privations to endure, the country being new and we so far from school and religious meetings. Our land was heavily timbered and required a great deal of hard work to get it in a condition to till. We had to go ten miles to mill.

"I went to school after I was nine or ten years old, what I could, and worked on the farm summers until September, 1813. I was drafted for a soldier, being then nineteen years old, and went to Fort George, in Canada, which had been taken by our forces in the spring before. I was three months in the army, and was then discharged.

"I continued with my parents until 1816, when I came to the town of Ridgeway and worked one summer for a brother of mine who had located one mile south of Knowlesville. The next spring I bought an article for one hundred and nineteen acres of land, upon which I went to work clearing.

"The title to the farm on which my father had resided and labored for twenty years in Seneca county proved bad and he was compelled to abandon it, leaving him almost penniless, and he came to the town of Shelby and began again anew.

"I built a house on my land in Ridgeway, in October, 1818. In May, 1919 I was married to Miss Elizabeth Burroughs, daughter of David Burroughs, of Shelby, and in June after, we moved into my house upon my farm, on which farm I have resided now forty-seven years.

"I worked my farm and my wife took care of things about the house and so we prospered as well as any of our neighbors. I built my first barn in 1820.

"Presbyterian churches were organized at Oak Orchard Creek, and at Millville at an early day. In the year 1831 a church edifice was erected by the Presbyterians at Knowlesville.

"During the years so long ago, although our labor was hard and fatiguing, yet we performed it with cheerfulness and in hope. Our neighbors knew no broils, families were all peaceful and friendly with each other, kind and attentive in sickness, even unto death. Thus we toiled on from year to year, the forest gradually retiring before us, and giving place to fruitful fields, and gardens, and orchards, yielding a generous reward for our labors.

"I built a new house which I finished in 1838, but our old log house was like a sacred spot, cherished in our memories. Since occupying my present residence I have seen the present wilderness exchanged for cultivated land, filled with the habitations of industry. I have witnessed the introduction into our county of those great works of improvement, the Erie Canal, the Railroad, and the Electric Telegraph, and now, in the evening of my day, I am enjoying a competence of this world's goods for my comfort, expecting soon to pass over the river, where I hope to meet not only the pioneers of the woods here, but all who are here seeking a better country."
